5. Statue of Juan Ponce de Leon in Fountain of Youth Park

- Saint Augustine, Florida

1950 (circa)

"Written records about life in Florida began with the arrival of the Spanish explorer and adventurer Juan Ponce de Leon. After being granted royal permission to explore lands to the northwest of Puerto Rico, Ponce de Leon waded ashore on the east coast of Florida on or around April 2, 1513. He called the land La Florida, in honor of the lush plant life and in honor of Pascua Florida, the Eastertime Spanish Feast of Flowers taking place at the time of his arrival. He was later named a Great Floridian in 2013."

20th century



7. Hotel Ponce de Leon from the Alcazar

1891

"Built as the Hotel Ponce de Leon by Henry M. Flagler and opened in 1888. The hotel was closed in 1967 and sold to Flagler College. It was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1975, and later became a U.S. National Historic Landmark on February 21, 2006."

8. Alcazar Hotel in St. Augustine, Florida

1888 (circa)

"The Alcazar Hotel was built by Henry Flagler in 1888. In 1948 Otto C. Lightner, the Chicago publisher and editor of "Hobbies" magazine, converted the empty hotel into the Lightner Museum. Three floors display his vast collection of art, antiques and other items. The building was later listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1971."

9. Outside wall of Fort San Marcos - Saint Augustine, Florida

April 9, 1930

"Located on Matanzas Bay at Saint Augustine, the fort reflects the type of early Spanish defense and is built of coquina, a unique composition of sand and sea-shells that grows harder with age."

10. Close-up view of the Bridge of Lions across Matanzas River at St. Augustine

1927 (circa)

"Bridge of Lions spans Matanzas River to Anastasia Island.

Built in 1927 the Bridge of Lions, also known as the Matanzas River Highway Bridge, consists of 23 approach spans and an 87-foot, double leaf, rolling lift bascule main span. It was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1982."
